Door County & Washington Island



June 2-5, 2019

Door County has a rich history on water and land. The peninsula is steeped in the stories of the first people to arrive here, including Native Americans and European settlers who fell in love with the beauty and natural bounty of the county.

The traditions of those early settlers are still celebrated and witnessed in communities throughout Door County.

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Itinerary:

• **Day 1**—when we arrive at Rowley's Bay Resort this evening you will be treated to an included dinner buffet. Tonight is a free evening to explore the property and enjoy the amenities. Rowley's is situated on 100 secluded acres dominating a pristine and undeveloped bay with 700 feet of Lake Michigan shoreline, making it one of the most picturesque locations in Door County.

The Door County peninsula extends at a north-northeastern angle into Lake Michigan, making one half of the shoreline primarily west-facing and the other half primarily east-facing; thus creating the "bay side" and the "lakeside." You will want to be sure to rise and shine early to enjoy the beautiful sunrise over Lake Michigan (Rowley's is listed as one of the top four locations in the Door County for sunrise views).



- **Day 2**—we will start our day with an included breakfast buffet at our resort and then it's off to board our ferry for Washington Island. This will be like nothing you've experienced before, as our bus will drive aboard the ferry and we will use that as our transportation on the Island. We will have a personal guide with us all day as we explore, dine (included lunch), and tour.

Washington Island is the largest of the 30 islands in Door County and is the only island community with a year round resident population and its' own economy.

On our tour we will visit Schoolhouse Beach located on a cove that is a sheltered harbor. The beach is named for the log schoolhouse built there in 1850. However, the most notable part of the beach is that it has no sand, but rather smooth limestone rocks. There are only four other places like this in the world. The rocks were glacier-polished over thousands of years and are each small geological treasures. In fact, souvenir hunters carried off so many of the rocks there is now a steep fine for removing one.

You will also visit the largest single-site lavender grower in the Midwest; Fragrant Isle Lavender Farm. The gardens provide a beautiful, fragrant environment to better understand the many uses and benefits of this unique herb.



Did you know there are over 40 different varieties of lavender?

Another highlight of our day will be a visit to the Stavkirke (Stave Church). Situated in a small forest grove, a winding path leads the way to the structure. The Stavkirke holds 38 people, has twelve 18-foot "stavs" or masts, all from the



Island. Eleven are Pine and one is White Fir. There are over 9,600 four inch wide shingles on the six-tiered roof.

When our day has ended on the Island, we will ferry back to the mainland where staff from the Resort will be waiting for our return to begin our included Fish Boil Dinner Buffet. A "fish boil" is an iconic local tradition. We will sit lakeside at our Resort around a hot fire with a boiling a cauldron of water, "Peter" will share the historical tradition of fish boils and the culinary details behind it. As the boil master throws kerosene on the fire, the pot boils over and eventually is carried in for all to enjoy! Don't care for fish? No problem, the buffet also includes chicken, meatballs, side dishes and a 14-foot salad, bakery, and dessert bar so no one will leave hungry.
