- Teddy Roosevelt Show: Joe Wiegand has been Medora's Teddy Roosevelt reprisor since 2012. Like the original TR, Joe travels throughout the country, from the White House, to all 50 states, he comes to life every summer in Medora.
- ND Cowboy Hall of Fame: immerse yourself in the exciting story of the plains horse culture, and learn about the experiences of North Dakota's Native Americans, homesteaders, ranchers and world-class rodeo cowboys.
- Spearfish Canyon Scenic Byway: this 22-mile route is one of the most awe-inspiring drives in the Black Hills, with breathtaking panoramic views, historic landmarks and scenic overlooks along a winding road that meanders through towering limestone cliffs, waterfalls, and abundant wildlife.
- Mount Rushmore National Park: majestic figures of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln, surrounded by the beauty of the Black Hills, tell the story of the birth, growth, development and preservation of this country.
- 1880 Train: a narrated 10-mile trip between Keystone and Hill City. Passengers view vistas of Harney Peak, mining encampments and participate in good old-fashioned fun. - Corn Palace: the Palace is redecorated each year with naturally colored corn and other grains and native grasses to make it "the agricultural show-place of the world". The Corn Palace is known around the world as a folk-art wonder on the prairie of South Dakota.
