- The Restaurant in the Mercantile closes at 7 pm. NOTE: there are many other great and unique locations within a ½ mile of The Mercantile where you can enjoy dinner.
- The General Store closes at 7 pm
- The Bakery closes at 6 pm
- Charlie's Sweet Shop closes at 8 pm
- P-Town Pizza closes at 9 pm

Day 6 – We return! We start our day in Bartlesville by touring the Frank Phillips Home and the Phillips 66 Museum. It was in 1905 that the Phillips brothers struck oil in this small town located in Indian Territory.

Then it's back to Pawhuska for an included group lunch at The Mercantile – a definite treat right down to the pecan pie! After lunch we will have a tour of the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Pawhuska; known for its unique stained glass windows.

We depart this town of about 3400 people with treasures, memories, and a few extra pounds.

This afternoon we will drive across Kansas and back into Missouri. We will once again spend the night at the Stoney Creek Hotel in St. Joseph and enjoy an included manager's dinner at the hotel. This is your last night, time to relax and enjoy the company of your new friends.

Schedule:

On travel days, a morning and afternoon comfort stop and a mid-day meal stop is incorporated into the itinerary. This allows everyone a much needed opportunity to exit the coach to stretch and refuel.

Day 1 – We begin! The bus will depart Parkers Prairie at 7 am (additional pick up locations are available along I-94 – see registration form).

It's the best feeling once we are all together! We will journey through Minnesota and Iowa and end up in St. Joseph (Missouri). We will spend the night at the Stoney Creek Hotel and will have an included manager's dinner at the hotel.

The property has a unique rustic charm with the following amenities: an onsite lounge where you can enjoy local craft beers, cocktails, and spirits indoors or outside on the patio; a heated indoor/outdoor pool; whirlpool; business center; and fitness center.

Day 2 – We bond! Today we depart Missouri and visit Kansas, Oklahoma, and end up in Texas.

A full-day of driving with an opportunity to get to know each other and have some fun on the bus.

Lunch will be at Golden Corral in Tulsa (Oklahoma) and is an included meal.

We will stop for the day in Richardson (Texas), a northern suburb of Dallas. Tonight we enjoy an included "Kickback" at the Drury Plaza Hotel. The Kickback is a rotating menu of hot food, as well as beer, wine, mixed drinks, and soda. Don't forget popcorn in the lobby until for your nighttime snack! Other amenities include: outdoor pool and whirlpool, business center, fitness center, and the Kitchen + Bar located in the lobby that is open until midnight.

Day 3 – We shop! We drive less than 2 hours and arrive in Waco (Texas)! Our driver will take us Downtown where there is bus parking. From there we will utilize Waco's free trolley to get to (and from) Magnolia Market (a.k.a The Silos). The Trolley runs every 15-20 minutes and provides access to other popular shopping, dining, and art venues in the downtown area. This way, you can determine how much time you want to spend at each location.



Lunch will be on your own. You can utilize the trolley to go downtown to a variety of locations or there are food trucks at the Silos (if you'd like to give that a try!). We just ask that everyone plan accordingly to be back at the bus by our determined time.

Our home for the night is the LaQuinta Inn & Suites Downtown Waco (Texas). There are restaurants within walking distance of the hotel for dinner tonight. When you get settled in at the hotel you can enjoy a cocktail at the lobby bar or relax in the outdoor pool and hot tub.

Day 4 – We remember! Today we travel North through Fort Worth (Texas) and into Oklahoma.

After lunch, we have included a visit to the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum. This stop will be a powerful and memorable experience and will include a Park Ranger's Tour explaining the Outdoor Symbolic Memorial. Your time in the Museum will be self-guided.

Tonight we arrive at the Fairfield Inn & Suites in Bartlesville (Oklahoma) where you will spend the next two nights. There are restaurants near the

hotel for dinner and the property has a pool and fitness center.

Day 5 – We indulge! We start our morning early as we want to try to beat most of the crowd. We take a short drive (approx. 45 minutes) from our hotel to Pawhuska (Oklahoma).

Once there, we access bus parking at the Chamber of Commerce and will then take a short walk (about 2-3 blocks) to The Mercantile. We will only spend about an hour (initially) to allow you to purchase a to-go lunch from the Restaurant and then it's back to the bus. You can enjoy your lunch on the porch of The Lodge or on the bus.

Tip 1: outside temperatures are typically in the 80's, keep dressings and sauces on the side.

Tip 2: You may want to leave your lunch in the bus while you tour and then come back to get it.

Once we are all back aboard our bus, we will make our way to Drummond Ranch. When we arrive and before we get separated; we will set our departure time from the Ranch.

There is a lot to see; horses, cattle, breathtaking views, every nook and cranny of The Lodge that is packed with Pioneer Woman products, and of course, Walter the basset hound. Use your time wisely. After your self-guided visit, you will be ready to get back to The Mercantile to buy some Pioneer Woman items.

Our driver will take us back to the Chamber of Commerce in Pawhuska. You will have the rest of the day to enjoy as you desire.
