Lunch will be on your own. You can utilize the trolley to go downtown to a variety of locations or there are food trucks at the Silos (if you'd like to give that a try!). We just ask that everyone plan accordingly to be back at the bus by our determined time.

Our home for the night is the LaQuinta Inn & Suites Downtown Waco (Texas). There are restaurants that deliver and many within walking distance of the hotel for dinner tonight. When you get settled in at the hotel you can enjoy a cocktail at the lobby bar or relax in the outdoor pool and hot tub.

#### **Day 6 – We return!**

Today we depart the town of Waco with treasures, memories, and a few extra pounds (if we've done it right!). As we venture out of Texas, we get another look at Oklahoma. Our last evening will be spent just across the border in Joplin (Missouri) at the Drury Inn. Where you once again will get a Kickback reception.

This is your last night, time to relax and enjoy the company of your new friends.

**Day 7 – We say goodbye!** Today is a travel day back home. Over the 7 days you have journeyed over 2000 miles and made many new friends.

# Schedule:

*On travel days, a morning and afternoon comfort stop and a mid-day meal stop is incorporated into the itinerary. This allows everyone a much needed opportunity to exit the coach to stretch and refuel.*

**Day 1 – We begin!** The bus will depart Parkers Prairie at 7 am (additional pick up locations are available along I-94 – see registration form).

It's the best feeling once we are all together! We will journey through Minnesota, Iowa, and Missouri and end up in Overland Park (Kansas) on the south side Kansas City. We will spend the night at the Drury Inn & Suites and will have an included Kickback. This is a rotating menu of hot food, as well as beer, wine, mixed drinks, and soda (for most, this is a sufficient dinner). Don't forget popcorn in the lobby until for your nighttime snack!

The property an indoor/outdoor pool and whirlpool; 24-hour business center; and 24-hour fitness center.

**Day 2 – We arrive at The Mercantile!** Today we depart our hotel early so that we can enjoy our day in Pawhuska. Once we arrive, we access bus parking at the Chamber of Commerce and will then take a short walk (about 2-3 blocks) to The Mercantile for our included group lunch – a definite treat right down to the pecan pie!

After lunch, we want you to enjoy the heck out of Pawhuska (Oklahoma)! Did you know that there is a movie being filmed just blocked from The Mercantile? Many stores are anxious for our arrival as they have seen little tourism and are looking forward to welcoming our group!

Dinner will be on your own tonight (you can relax and a meal in Pawhuska or bring something to go and enjoy it on the bus or at the hotel).

Below are some key hours for Ree Drummond's establishments:

- The Restaurant in the Mercantile closes at 7 pm. NOTE: there are many other great and unique locations within a ½ mile of The Mercantile where you can enjoy dinner.
- The General Store closes at 7 pm
- The Bakery closes at 6 pm
- Charlie's Sweet Shop closes at 8 pm
- P-Town Pizza closes at 9 pm

We will depart around 7 pm as our hotel is about 40 minutes away (and we want you to get a good night's rest).

**Day 3 – The Lodge!** We start our day touring the Price Tower in Bartlesville (Oklahoma). This building is 19 stories and was commissioned for use by Price Company as the headquarters for their local oil pipeline and chemical firm. It was designed by Frank Lloyd Wright and is only one of two of his buildings that is vertically oriented.

Later we are off for a guided tour of the Frank Phillips home; a neo-classical mansion that was built in 1909. We conclude our time in Bartlesville with an included lunch at Dink's World Famous Pit BBQ.

After lunch, we return to Pawhuska to satisfy your sweet cravings and grab those last souvenirs before we take a short drive into the country to spend the afternoon at Drummond Ranch. When we arrive at the Ranch, your time is self-guided. Before we get separated we will set our departure time from the Ranch.

There is a lot to see; horses, cattle, breathtaking views, every nook and cranny of The Lodge that is packed with Pioneer Woman products, and of course, Walter the basset hound. Use your time wisely.

Our home for the night is the Tonkawa Hotel and Casino in Tonkawa (Oklahoma). It is close to an hour from the Ranch. You can relax in the outdoor pool, have a little gaming fun in the casino, and enjoy a beverage and meal.

**Day 4 – We go south!** Just before we get to Oklahoma City (Oklahoma) we will take a short drive down Historic Route 66. We will stop at the famous Arcadia Round Barn built in 1898. Around thirty years after the round barn was built, Route 66 came along, and it ran right past the barn. The unusual landmark quickly became one of the most photographed attractions on the highway.

From there we go a short distance to POPS 66 Soda Ranch known for its 66 foot tall neon soda bottle. You can't miss it! We will enjoy lunch here and you can explore the many soda options; only 700 types, but hey 80 of them are different varieties of Root Beer!

After lunch, we have included a visit to the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum. This stop will be a powerful and memorable experience and will include a Park Ranger's Tour explaining the Outdoor Symbolic Memorial. Your time in the Museum will be self-guided.

We spend tonight in Frisco (Texas) at the Drury Inn in the northern part of Dallas and enjoy another Kickback this evening at the hotel.

**Day 5 – We dream!** We start with a couple hour drive south, venturing through Dallas and
